"Bucket Lists" By Shawn Sullivan

õBuckets of rain, buckets of tears, got all them buckets coming out of my earsí ö. Lately Iøve been hearing a lot about bucket lists. Iøm not sure if this is because of the õpandemic ageö that we seem to be living in, or if itøs just worked its way into phrases that people like to use, like õkick the bucketö. How did õbucketsö become slang for passing on? When a baby is born, we donøt say, õthereøs a new bucketö, or õhappy bucket dayö. When it comes to fly-fishers bucket lists, they are usually destinations.ö Iød like to fish for cut-throats in Yellowstone, I want to catch five-pound brook trout in Labrador, I have to get over to Patagonia one of these days.ö


Iøm not sure if I have a bucket list, I have trouble thinking that far ahead. Speaking of heads, I plan to have mine cryogenically frozen, so I donøt really need a bucket list, since Iøl have lots of time. I guess Iøwe always had fly-fishing goals, that Iød like to accomplish. Iød like to be able to cast my entire fly line. Itøs an impractical skill, when it comes to daily fishing, kind of like having a magician over your house for dinner, who keeps making rabbits pop up in unexpected places. õLook, thereøs a rabbit in your toaster oven!ö. Itøs become an obsession. I watch every video, live demos, read articles, yet it still eludes me. I go to the park, or my backyard, and I try to imitate what I see others doing to get that entire line to shoot out. I think I have it figured out and then it usually falls apart at about seventy feet. How do I know, I marked every ten feet on my fly line with permanent marker. Thatøs how crazy itøs getting!


Maybe Iød just like to stand next to a spin fisher in the surf one day, make a one-hundred-and-fifty-foot cast, and say õhow do you like them apples?ö. There really arenøt too many situations that call for a hundred-foot cast. I can imagine myself fishing for Bonefish somewhere, and the guide says, õone hundred feet, at three-fifteenö. I quickly shoot line into my back cast, allow my arm to drift slightly back, propel the butt of my rod forward, leading with the reel, pull a perfectly executed double haul, speed up to an abrupt stop, the line soars over the water, and the guide says, õyou blew it, Mon!ö Itøs then I come to the realization that I canøt see fish that are fifty feet away, never mind a hundred.


What would it be like to fish with me if I was a hundred-foot caster? Iød have to warn my fishing buddies to stay at least a hundred feet away from me, in any direction, so that I donøt accidentally maim them with one of my rocket casts. Iød have to walk a hundred feet every time I got snagged in a tree. The places that I normally fish wouldnøt be big enough to contain my new superpower. Iød have to take my kayak out to Lake George, or Lake Ontario, or Lake Michigan, where I could comfortably cast to my heartøs content.

I guess when it comes to most things in life, including fishing, I dongt have a õbucket listö. I have a õneeds and wantsö list. Take a look at any fly fishersøgear collection and itøs easy to see the divide. ÕDid I really need that antique Fenwick six-foot fiber glass rod?ö I dongt need to cast a hundred feet, I just really, really want to! And when I finally, hopefully, maybe, reach that goal, Iøll be equally elated and disappointed, because now Iøll have to come up with some new ridiculous goal to achieve, like becoming a Tenkara master and insisting that everyone address me as õSenseiö. When I was fifty-nine, I decided that I wanted to run a full marathon in my sixtieth year. I had run three in my forties, so I felt certain that I could do it. I signed up for a half marathon, as a tune-up, even though I hadnøt run one in years, and began training. On the day of the race, I felt like I was ready, and I told my wife I should be done in about two and a half hours. Well, I crossed the finish line, five hours later, in the pouring rain, and it darn near killed me. The training was fun, the race, not so much. I guess the thing that I realize now is that itøs the journey, not the destination, thatøs important. My obsession with long distance casting wonøt make me a better fisherman, but it has made me go back and look at some basic casting principles that I need to relearn. I like practicing at the park and with the clubøs casting instructors so itøs not a complete waste of time. Just donøt stand too close, I canøt guarantee your safety!

Good news members, our Board approved fishing for **April 15.** Additionally, if you want to fish, there will be **2 Sessions: 8am - 12pm & 12pm - 4pm.** Please observe the rules listed below so all our members can safely enjoy their day on the river.

Please do not enter the park before 7:10 AM.

We will be restricting the number of fishermen on the river to 10 members per session.

All members that want to fish must register with **Ted bany** by phone, email or text; **first come first served**; he will confirm your reservation. If you need to cancel please do so 72 hours prior to **Monday, April 15** so that your reservation can be offered to another Flyrodder on the wait list. Members are restricted to one fishing session in order to give more LIFR members an opportunity to fish. You might be able to fish a second session if we fail to get 10 fishermen at each session. Ted will keep a waiting list

to advise of another fishing session opportunity if requested.

Night/Sport Fishing Permit: The New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation . Long Island Region - will be accepting dashboard permit applications until March 31, 2023. They will go back on sale **September 7 through December 31, 2024**. There will be no mail-in or in-person sales. One application can be used for multiple permit requests for the same vehicle. Permit(s) will be mailed to the address indicated on the application. For questions, please call the Permit Department at (631) 321-3770.

To purchase a 2023 Dashboard Permit Apply online through DocuSign: visit *parks.ny.gov*, Long Island Region to apply. Valid credit card is required for payment. Permit(s) will be mailed once processed.

Fees are as follows and determined by issuing state of the applicants drivers license:

4 X 4 FISHING \$80 (NY resident), \$125 (out of state)

CAMP HERO FISHING \$40 (NY resident), \$75 (out of state)

NIGHT/SPORT FISHING \$35 (NY resident), \$60 (out of state)

To purchase a Night/Sport Fishing permit.

YOU MUST HAVE THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS WHEN APPLYING:

- 1. Valid e-mail address
- 2. Valid drivers license of the applicant
- 3. Valid vehicle registration and license plate information
- 4. Valid NYS DEC Recreational Saltwater/Marine Fishing Registry ID # (required for fishing dashboard permits).





If you are not a business and you have a bag of line, send it to the following address. Remember that birds and marine animals become entangled in fishing line. Do what you can. Make sure the line is clean of debris, hooks, and metal attachments.
