Dances With Fish By Shawn Sullivan

Well not really. I don't dance with fish. I sometimes trip and stumble as I'm trying to land a fish, which might look like some kind of crazy punk rock dance moves. Sometimes I do a little victory dance when I land a particularly tough fish, but I digress. What I really want to talk about is fishing music.

I like to listen to songs about fishing when I'm in my car driving to a fishing spot. In some strange kind of logic, I feel like it increases my chances of having a good day. I haven't recorded any related statistics; it's more of a hunch.

My favorite musician that I listen to on these trips is Greg Brown. I'm particularly fond of his song, "The Laughing River", which is about a farmed out minor league baseball player who's retiring and dreaming of this river that he wants to fish. "Well I'm trading this old bat for a fishing pole, I'm gonna let the laughing river flow right into my soul". One of Greg's pet peeves is that people keep yelling out during his concerts "How's the fishing Greg?". I have seen him live several times and I had to restrain myself from yelling out the dreaded question. As a fisherman myself I guess I just wanted to see if he'd take the bait.

My first love of fishing music began with the Andy Griffith Show. When I would see little Opie and his dad Andy making their way down to the fishing hole with that tune whistling in the background, it made me want to go fishing (no place to fish in the south Bronx), and to teach myself how to whistle so that I could copy it note for note, which of course drove everyone around me crazy. I eventually moved to Long Island when I was fourteen and found friends who liked nothing better than to spend the day fishing at Hempstead Lake. ". I don't use bait which might explain why sometimes I get the fishing blues.

I guess if a musician writes a song about fishing it's bound to have a limited audience, as opposed to writing a song called "Pretty Women" for instance. There are some bands that you'd expect to write a song about fishing. The band "Phish" doesn't have one in their catalogue. What's up with that. Country Joe and the Fish played before a huge audience at Woodstock and didn't even play one song about fishing. I don't get it. Well, the Beatles never wrote any songs about bugs so what did I expect.

When I was researching this topic to see if there were a lot of "fishing" songs I hadn't heard about, I discovered two that I didn't know, but that I really like. Both seem to be about a couple going fishing on their first date. Now that's my kind of romance story! "Fishing In the Dark" by the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band is a more typical kind of love story where the young couple is just as happy to lay on their backs and gaze dreamily at the stars. I kind of prefer the one by Maddie and Tae called "Shut Up and Fish". The boy wants to make out, but the girl really wants to fish and eventually she can't take anymore and just pushes him into the water; "just a little push, cause he wouldn't shut up and fish". I couldn't be prouder if she was my own daughter.

Good news members, our Board approved fishing for **this month.** Additionally, if you want to fish, there will be **2 Sessions:** 8am - 12pm and 12pm - 4pm. Please observe the rules listed be low so all our members can safely enjoy their day on the river.

Please do not enter the park before 7:10 AM.

We will be restricting the number of fishermen on the river to 10 members per session.

All members that want to fish must register with **Ted bany** by phone, email or text; **first come first served**; he will confirm your reservation. If you need to cancel please do so 72 hours prior to **Monday, August 18** so that your reservation can be offered to another Flyrodder on the wait list. Members are restricted to one fishing session in order to give more LIFR members an opportunity to fish. You might be able to fish a second session if we fail to get 10 fishermen at each session. Ted will keep a waiting list to advise of another fishing session opportunity if requested.

Night/Sport Fishing Permit: The New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation . Long Island Region - will be accepting dashboard permit applications until March 31, 2025. They will go back on sale **September 7 through December 31, 2025**. There will be no mail-in or in-person sales. One application can be used for multiple permit requests for the same vehicle. Permit(s) will be mailed to the address indicated on the application. For questions, please call the Permit Department at (631) 321-3770.

To purchase a 2025 Dashboard Permit Apply online through DocuSign: visit *parks.ny.gov*, Long Island Region to apply. Valid credit card is required for payment. Permit(s) will be mailed once processed.

Fees are as follows and determined by issuing state of the applicants drivers license:

4 X 4 FISHING \$80 (NY resident), \$125 (out of state)

CAMP HERO FISHING \$40 (NY resident), \$75 (out of state)

NIGHT/SPORT FISHING \$35 (NY resident), \$60 (out of state)

To purchase a Night/Sport Fishing permit.

YOU MUST HAVE THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS WHEN APPLYING:

- 1. Valid e-mail address
- 2. Valid drivers license of the applicant
- 3. Valid vehicle registration and license plate information
- 4. Valid NYS DEC Recreational Saltwater/Marine Fishing Registry ID # (required for fishing dashboard permits).

If you are not a business and you have a bag of line, send it to the following address. Remember that birds and marine animals become entangled in fishing line. Do what you can. Make sure the line is clean of debris, hooks, and metal attachments.
