




LI Flyrodders and Art Flick got together to teach High School students how to fly fish. Lots of fun and lots of fish. Thanks to all the guides that helped.









Back to the Future

Imagine if I could go back in time and talk to my younger self about flyfishing, what would I say? I've been thinking about this lately due to the large numbers of new members that are joining the club, many who have never flyfished before. Sometimes in life you will come to a fork in the road. One could be called the "easy way", and the other the "hard way". I generally chose the hard way, although I didn't realize it at the time. I would talk to "Blockhead" (that's what I call my younger self) about some of the things that he could have done differently and saved himself a lot of grief.

"Remember when you bought your first fly rod? It was a Cortland five weight combo. You would run over to South Pond a couple of days a week, casting wooly buggers and poppers. You never caught anything because you couldn't cast more than fifteen feet, and the pond didn't have a lot of fish to begin with. It had to be at least a year of snags, tangles, and whip snapping breakoffs before you could manage a semi-acceptable cast. If I could go back in time I would say, listen Blockhead, you can't learn to cast and fish at the same time. You just keep making the same mistakes over and over. They say it takes ten thousand casts before you start to look like you know what you're doing. You're at fifty thousand and going nowhere fast!"

Somehow Blockhead's casting got a little better, but he was stuck in second gear. He came to believe that it was because he was using a cheap fly rod. If he could save up enough money to get a better-quality rod, he was sure he could learn to cast as well as Brad Pitt. He saw an ad that said Orvis was having a sale. He bought a Silver Label nine-foot six weight. His goal at the time was to become the first Bassmaster to win a championship using a flyrod. He had dreams of riding into the arena on his tricked-out Bass boat, holding up a ten-pound Bass that he caught on a fly of his own design. He bought a used Sears aluminum v-hull boat and built a casting platform out of plywood. He took the boat out to Artist's Lake and began pounding the bank with streamers. He caught a Pickerel on his second cast and then the wind picked up and on his very next cast, he heard a sound like a firecracker and saw the tip of his fly rod sliding down his fly line towards the streamer. "Well, Blockhead, that was a hard lesson. If I could go back in time I would give you a fly-casting intervention. No-body wants to see a grown man throw a temper tantrum on a boat in the middle of a lake!"

Blockhead's dream of becoming a fly-fishing Bassmaster seemed unlikely, so he started to look around for something else to aspire to. He saw a magazine with a photo of a fly fisherman holding a Striped Bass. A light bulb went off. A Bass is a Bass, like what they say about roses. He got a few books out of the library, and figured out what he would need to get started. He bought a nine-weight rod, with a ten-weight line, a large reel, and a dishwashing basin to hold the line. He would show those fishing buddies of his who laughed at his Bassmaster dream. He'd start a new tv show, the Striped Bassmasters! He took his new setup over to West End 2 at Jones Beach and walked through the dunes to fish the inlet side. It was windy, and he wasn't getting much line out. He put on a heavier fly and almost knocked himself unconscious when he whacked himself on the head. He thought that maybe he wasn't putting enough force into the cast, so he gave it everything he had and the next thing he knew, his fly slammed into the rod and he had broken another rod tip. "How many times do you have to keep doing the same dumb things before you learn? At least you were smart enough to buy rods that had lifetime warranties. You weren't just a danger to yourself and your equipment. Remember that time you hit that woman who was walking behind you, in the neck with a Clouser Minnow?".

"Alright my younger self, I'm going to take pity on you and share some wisdom that's taken me over thirty years to figure out. You probably won't listen because you're a thick-headed pain in the neck, but here goes. All your problems, your broken rods, your eventual tendonitis, your aching shoulders, your short casts, all boil down to one thing. You need someone to teach you the right way to cast a fly rod. You don't need to buy an expensive rod. You would have been better off taking that money and spending it on casting lessons from a certified instructor. There are some things that you can learn from a book or a videotape, casting a fly rod isn't one of them. Now untangle that thirty feet of fly line from your trolling motor and go get some lessons!"

They will go back on sale **September 7 through December 31, 2025**. There will be no mail-in or in-person sales. One application can be used for multiple permit requests for the same vehicle. Permit(s) will be mailed to the address indicated on the application. For questions, please call the Permit Department at (631) 321-3770.

To purchase a 2025 Dashboard Permit Apply online through DocuSign: visit *parks.ny.gov*, Long Island Region to apply. Valid credit card is required for payment. Permit(s) will be mailed once processed.

Fees are as follows and determined by issuing state of the applicant's driver's license:

4 X 4 FISHING \$80 (NY resident), \$125 (out of state)

CAMP HERO FISHING \$40 (NY resident), \$75 (out of state)

NIGHT/SPORT FISHING \$35 (NY resident), \$60 (out of state)

To purchase a Night/Sport Fishing permit.

YOU MUST HAVE THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS WHEN APPLYING:

- 1. Valid e-mail address
- 2. Valid driver's license of the applicant
- 3. Valid vehicle registration and license plate information
- 4. Valid NYS DEC Recreational Saltwater/Marine Fishing Registry ID # (required for fishing dashboard permits).



Berkley has a program for recycling used fishing line. If you call them and you are a business, they will send you a shipping box (prepaid) to send in the line. Their only stipulation

(prepaid) to send in the line. Their only stipulation is that the line be clean and free of all debris, hooks, and metal attachments. Here's the Berkley number.

If you are not a business and you have a bag of line, send it to the following address. Remember that birds and marine animals become entangled in fishing line. Do what you can. Make sure the line is clean of debris, hooks, and metal attachments.
