

It Needs a Little Salt By Shawn Sullivan

My wifeøs spaghetti? Just kidding. Actually, my wifeøs Italian, and a great cook. Unfortunately, it turned out that in my early forties I found out I was allergic to tomato sauce. Bye-bye lasagna, eggplant rollatini, ziti, etc.; But I digress. Iøm talking about salt in your water, your fishing water, that is. It took me a while to get around to it, but once I started to fly fish in saltwater, I couldnøt believe how many things it had in common with freshwater fishing. I didnøt have to start from scratch; I just had to adapt to saltwater what I already knew from freshwater.


If you like streamer fishing, you'dl love throwing a weighted fly in the salt. It's the same idea of making a quartering cast, letting the fly swing, and then stripping it back. One difference is that if you misjudge your cast and a weighted saltwater fly hits you in the head, it will hurt like heck or break off the top of your rod. Ask me how I know. You can also fish an unweighted streamer in the salt, using a method very similar to a wet fly swing. I mostly fish inlets or river mouth estuary, where the incoming and outgoing tides have flow, very similar to a freshwater river. Worried about your casting distance, no problem. Cast your fly into the current, feed line out as it swings, and then strip it back. You can cover a lot of water that way.

Can saltwater fly-fishing match the gentle coordination required to softly drop a fly in front of a feeding trout? Probably not, but there are opportunities to toss a fly to fish that you can see. When I fished mainly on the North Shore, I would occasionally spot a Striped Bass cruising along the bank of the shore, on a bright sunny day. I would try casting in front of the fish, but I really had no clue, and I usually would get a severe case of buck fever, and either hit the fish on the head or line the fish. I have been able to catch cruising Fluke and Bluefish, who arenøt as easily spooked as stripers. False Albacore can seemingly only be caught when theyøre exploding on the surface. You have a thirty second window to get your fly in front of them before they disappear and show up thirty yards down the beach. It will give you the same thrill you get from having exactly the right fly in the middle of a Caddis hatch. Just be careful not to get spooled (ask me again how I know).

When Iøm fishing in freshwater, Iøve always wanted to be the person who carries one small box of flies in a shirt pocket and still has a great day. The problem is that Iøm paranoid that I wonøt have the right fly for the water or hatch that Iøm fishing. I end up carrying half a dozen boxes, many that never see the light of day. In the salt I carry one box of flies, with basically two patterns, a spool of fluorocarbon, and pliers. You have no idea how freeing it is to just wander around without feeling the weight of my twenty-pound vest.

Friends always want to know if flyfishing saltwater is harder. I usually say fish are fish, whatever kind of water theyœre in. When you stand in the ocean or bay looking out at a vast horizon, it can be intimidating. Where do you begin? The easiest thing to do is look for signs of life; bait in the water, diving birds, fish breaking the surface. Think structure. Any unusual changes in the shore formations have a chance of attracting fish. I look for points, coves, sandbars, and rocks. Just like in freshwater, the ocean also has things equivalent to pools, pocket water, and riffles. Wherever you see faster moving water meeting slower water, thereæs a pretty good chance you@l find predatory fish holding there.

Except when I invite fly fishing friends to come along, Iøm usually the only one on the beach with a fly rod. Iøm getting tired of people asking me if I can catch fish with that contraption. Iøm usually pretty patient, explaining why I do it and why itøs so much fun, but it can get annoying. Iøm thinking of getting a shirt that says; this is a flyrod, I have caught fish with it, spin fishing is easier, fly fishing is more fun!



Good news members, our Board approved fishing for **this month.** Additionally, if you want to fish, there will be **2 Sessions: 8am - 12pm and 12pm - 4pm.** Please observe the rules listed be low so all our members can safely enjoy their day on the river.

Please do not enter the park before 7:10 AM.

We will be restricting the number of fishermen on the river to 10 members per session.

All members that want to fish must register with **Ted bany** by phone, email or text; **first come first served**; he will confirm your reservation. If you need to cancel please do so 72 hours prior to **Monday, November 17** so that your reservation can be offered to another Flyrodder on the wait list. Members are restricted to one fishing session in order to give more LIFR members an opportunity to fish. You might be able to fish a second session if we fail to get 10 fishermen at each session. Ted will keep a waiting list to advise of another fishing session opportunity if requested.

Night/Sport Fishing Permit: The New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation . Long Island Region - will be accepting dashboard permit applications until March 31, 2025. They will go back on sale **September 7 through December 31, 2025**. There will be no mail-in or in-person sales. One application can be used for multiple permit requests for the same vehicle. Permit(s) will be mailed to the address indicated on the application. For questions, please call the Permit Department at (631) 321-3770.

To purchase a 2025 Dashboard Permit Apply online through DocuSign: visit *parks.ny.gov*, Long Island Region to apply. Valid credit card is required for payment. Permit(s) will be mailed once processed.

Fees are as follows and determined by issuing state of the applicants drivers license:

4 X 4 FISHING \$80 (NY resident), \$125 (out of state)

CAMP HERO FISHING \$40 (NY resident), \$75 (out of state)

NIGHT/SPORT FISHING \$35 (NY resident), \$60 (out of state)

To purchase a Night/Sport Fishing permit.

YOU MUST HAVE THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS WHEN APPLYING:

- 1. Valid e-mail address
- 2. Valid drivers license of the applicant
- 3. Valid vehicle registration and license plate information
- 4. Valid NYS DEC Recreational Saltwater/Marine Fishing Registry ID # (required for fishing dashboard permits).

If you are not a business and you have a bag of line, send it to the following address. Remember that birds and marine animals become entangled in fishing line. Do what you can. Make sure the line is clean of debris, hooks, and metal attachments.
